Binding:

Original binding (250 \times 195 mm) in marbled paper over paper boards (marbre escargot, ~Marbled paper, tab. XXIV, 1-18 – 18th-century). On the spine, a label with the title. *Toralli, Rime e Prose.*

History:

The manuscript was created under direct supervision by the author, Vito Niccolò Toralli (his signatures on f. 6v° and on f. 183v°). The preparation of the manuscript finished in January 1772 (183v°: *Napoli, 6 del 1772*). The copy was meant as a gift for Frederick II, King of Prussia. Very interesting drawings by the Dutch landscape artist, Willem Fortuyn (1721-1788), decorating the manuscript. There are no explicit traces of the manuscript reaching the king, but it is indirectly mentioned in *Handschriftenkataloge der Königlichen Biliothek und Preussischen Statsbibliothek Berlin. Dienstkatalog 8: Codices manuscripti italici (Mss. Ital.)*, n. 13. Probably the king or his chancery presented the manuscript to the library. Lemm, p. 79.

Content:

ff. 2r°-189r° Vito Niccolò Toralli: Rime e prose panegiriche in onore di Federico II Re di Prussia.

A collection of panegyrical sonnets devoted to king Frederick II. The author, Vito Niccolò Toralli of Naples, is further unknown. He sent his work as a gift to the described ruler (he mentions this himself on f. $184r^{\circ}$). The work consists of a dedication, an introductory part $(7r^{\circ}-9v^{\circ}-4 \text{ sonnets and a panegyric in Latin})$, a main part (120 numbered panegyrical sonnets and "Presepe del Santo Natale" – with commentary in author's prose) and a closing sonnet (184v°) with commentary.
