## Binding:

A special box for documents covered in marbled paper (18<sup>th</sup> century); measurements:

298 × 212 mm. A label on the spine: Varia de administr. / regni.

## History:

The manuscript is a collection of administrative documents ordered by a historian Friedrich von Raumer (1781-1873) for the needs of his research. Later he donated the manuscript to the Königliche Bibliothek.

## Content:

In total there are 13 documents concerning the city of Venice (years 1820-1840)). 1 – a table with the number of people and remunerations in the naval artillery corps; 2 – a table with the number of people and remunerations in the marine corps; 3 – the number of people and remunerations of the corps of Austrian admirals; 4 – a list of Venetian ships; 5 – a list of employees of the Venetian Arsenal; 6 – a table with the number of people and remunerations in the Venetian marine corps; 7 – the planned budget of Venice; 8 – statistics concerning expenditure in Venice on the "Istituti di Pubblica Beneficienza"; 9 – income and expenditure concerning charity or social expenditure; 10 – data concerning ships landing in the port of Venice from 1836-1838; 11 – income from land taxes in Venice; 12 – a document in German concerning cadastral measurements in the Venetian areas; 13 – a document in German concerning customs duties in Venice. Professor F. von Raumer used the data from the documents sent to him from Venice in the following historical works: "Italy and Italians", London 1840 and "Italien, Beiträge zur Kenntnis dieses landes", Leipzig 1840. Sometimes he quoted the documents in extenso, and sometimes he referred to the overall analysis of the data from the documents.
